Augusta Goldschmidt-Seliger Zeligman Goldschmidt



Augusta Goldschmidt–Seliger and Zeligman Goldschmidt fled Halberstadt, Germany in 1939 after witnessing Krystall Nacht in 1938. Zeligman had been a government employee and Augusta ran a kosher cantine for Jewish workers. They arrived with all their belongings, except their money or bank accounts and were supported by Emile Wesly in order to survive. They had a son who had emigrated to Palestine and who tried to arrange with the British for a "Certificate". This life saving document arrived a few days after they had been arrested and sent to Sobibor.
